Public Safety Committee Regular Meeting
October 26, 2021

1. Call to Order

The regular meeting of the Public Safety Committee was called to order via teleconference at 5:11 p.m. by Chair Romero.

Present: Vice Chair Ginyard, Member Rishebarger, and Member Collins

Staff: City Manager Irwin, Fire Chief Gregory, Patterson District Ambulance Director Willette, Patterson District Ambulance CEO Hennings, and Administrative Manager Best

Not Present: Chair Romero, Member Crozier, Member Flynn

4. Motion to Approve Meeting Minutes of August 31, 2021

Member Rishebarger moved to approve the meeting minutes of July 27, 2021. The motion was seconded by Vice Chair Ginyard and approved by a 3-0 vote.

5. Del Puerto Health Care District Presentation

Ambulance Director Willette gave a presentation on the Del Puerto Health Care District. There was information about staffing, billing, funding, response information, and more.

Vice Chair Ginyard asked about the timeline for expansion. Ambulance Director Willette stated it took approximately three years to acquire the land. It has the potential to take three to five years before construction/completion.

Member Rishebarger asked about revenue and taxes for houses and businesses. He also asked about apartments and if the revenue was based on number of units. Paul stated they do collect revenue from the apartment buildings, and it is based on the number of units. Most properties, agriculture included, provide a fee for ambulance services.

Member Rishebarger asked about how funding is received for the expansion of the ambulance quarters. Ambulance Director Willette stated a Nexxus study in terms of residential and commercial growth will be completed and a fee will be assessed. Those fees pay for the expansion but not ongoing expenses.

Member Rishebarger asked if the ambulance has received any COVID funding. Ambulance Director Willette stated they did receive a small amount in one of the initial fundings.

City Manager Irwin stated the City received AARPA funds through the Federal Government, and they are putting together grant issuances for small businesses. Del Puerto Health Care District would be eligible to apply.

Member Collins asked how many people do you need per ambulance? Is current staffing sufficient? Ambulance Director Willette stated that the ambulance is staffed with two people. Staffing normally consists of an EMT (120 hours of training) and a Paramedic (1200 hours of training). That would be a typical staffing pattern.

Member Collins asked if there is a program offered to high school students who are interested in working as a EMT or paramedic. Ambulance Director Willette stated they do participate in the high school's prep project, and they also participate in the career health services path. They also offer ride-a-longs to high school students.
