



Project Background

From the late 1950s to late 1960s, Interstate 5 [I-5] was under construction from San Diego to the Canadian border. In the mid-1960s, the Sperry Avenue interchange was built to serve the small agricultural community of Patterson. Since then, Patterson has experienced significant growth, adding substantial demand to the Sperry Avenue interchange. Additionally, existing and planned development projects next to the project site continue to add to demands on the interchange.

Project Purpose and Need

The purpose of the Interstate 5/Sperry Avenue Interchange Project is to accomplish the following:

- Increase the capacity of the interchange to accommodate existing and future traffic demands;
- Improve operations and the movement of goods;
- Enhance safety.

Improvements to the interchange are necessary to meet the increasing traffic demand associated with continued and planned commercial and industrial growth in the City of Patterson.

Project Description

The project will upgrade the I-5/Sperry Avenue interchange. Improvements associated with all build alternatives under consideration include widening Sperry Avenue and widening or reconstructing the on- and off-ramps. Sperry Avenue will be widened in each direction between Del Puerto Canyon Road and Rogers Road.

Project Schedule

The project is now in the preliminary engineering and environmental phase. Following completion of this phase, the project will go through final engineering design with construction tentatively scheduled to begin in 2020. Advance notice of all construction activity will be coordinated with nearby property owners and key stakeholders before work begins.

What Will Happen at the Public Information Meeting?

You are invited to come to the public meeting on April 20, 2017, at any time between 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. to visit the exhibits and discuss the project with team members. A brief presentation will be made at 6:30 p.m. by Stanislaus County representatives and project team members to explain the project history, what studies are underway, and additional tasks that must be completed before construction begins.
